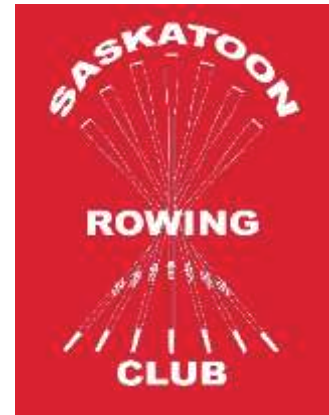


SASKATOON ROWING CLUB:

Learn to Row Coach Position(s)

Notice: At this time, Saskatoon Rowing Club is planning to hire summer staff for a regular on-water season. Given the uncertainty surrounding COVID-19, we cannot guarantee that all positions will be filled and/or all terms of employment outlined below will be applicable.



Position Overview

Learn to Row Coaches will be enthusiastic and motivated individuals with a background in the sport of rowing and knowledge of equipment and the basics of the rowing stroke. The Learn to Row Coaches will administer Learn to Row sessions while providing a safe and fun environment for all participants.

The Learn to Row Coaches will report to the Club Manager.

Start Date & Wage

- Coaching will begin May 4th, 2020 and conclude July 31st, 2020 with possibility of extension, depending on demand for LTR sessions.
- Learn to Row Coaches will be paid a salary based on number of LTR sessions coached (one session = six lessons over two weeks).
- Salary is \$100 per LTR session, and the club plans to offer twelve sessions throughout the spring and summer season.

Preferred Qualifications and Skills

- Experience in Rowing is beneficial
- Learn to Row Coaching certification is an asset (completed or underway)
- Respect in Sport certification is required.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Pleasure Craft Operator Card (boating license) is essential
- First aid and CPR (preferred)
- Mature and effective communication skills
- Problem-solving and ability to manage multiple tasks at once are

- Positive attitude and ability to work with a variety of different skill levels

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Coach a range of skill levels and abilities, from very novice to intermediate
- Coordination of LTR practices, including communication to participants
- Assigning equipment and appropriate crews during LTR sessions
- Work as a team with other LTR coach, receive mentoring and feedback from High Performance Coach and Club Manager
- Recommend appropriate membership options or further LTR development for participants upon completion of LTR session
- Manage the day-to-day equipment allocation among participating athletes in cooperation with Club Coach, and share equipment when necessary
- Maintain boathouse and LTR equipment, notifying administration and Equipment Manager of necessary repairs
- Ensure all safety equipment is current and functional, coach boats are stocked with supplies, and be familiar with Emergency Action Plan and implementation
- Ensure all athletes know and understand Saskatoon Rowing Club safety policies and guidelines and that all are adhering to these guidelines
- Retain open dialogue with the Club Manager to share information about upcoming sessions and athletes
- Foster a program of inclusiveness and respect
- Represent Saskatoon Rowing Club and its membership to the best of your ability
